



Seven Decades of Gaza

A Saga of Struggle, Strength, and Survival

Gaza is one of the world's most densely populated regions, with about half the population being children under the **age of 18**.

For more than seventy years, **Gaza** has been caught in a cycle of relentless hardship, with the profound **losses** and deep **suffering** of its **people leaving** a devastating mark on the **region** and humanity



However, the region has faced its most severe crisis over the past year. The rapid escalation in tragedy with no foreseeable end is beyond imagination

A Catastrophe Beyond Words

The Toll of Gaza's Crisis Since October 2023...

Since October 2023, the devastation in Gaza has reached unimaginable levels, obliterating lives, homes, and futures in a relentless wave of destruction.

Death and Injury Toll

The official death toll has surpassed **40,000**, including nearly **16,500 children**. However, that number does not include the bodies that are still under rubble or missing. Experts claim that the actual death toll is significantly higher

More than **90,000** individuals wounded

Over **10,000** individuals are missing



Infrastructure Damage

More than **half of Gaza's** homes were destroyed or damaged

80% of commercial facilities affected

85% of school buildings damaged

Over **70% of health** facilities are either non-functional or severely damaged

65% of road networks were damaged

65% of cropland damaged

Over **1.6 million people** face food insecurity, with high levels of child malnutrition

Over **70% of Gaza's** water is contaminated

These statistics represent the most severe **healthcare** and **environmental** crisis the world has ever seen.

A Rapid Response to Crisis

Humaniti's longstanding presence in Gaza enabled us to respond immediately to the crisis that began in October 2023. Thanks to our established partnerships, we **mobilized aid without delay**, ensuring critical support reached the most vulnerable from day one.

How We Adapted

Delivering Aid in a War Zone

In conflict zones, delivering aid safely and promptly is a major challenge. Restricted access and security risks often delay humanitarian convoys, and aid workers face constant threats.

Security Risks: Despite threats, we ensure aid delivery

Consistent Action: To minimize harm and foster hope

Key Achievements

From October 2023 to August 2024, we have made a significant impact through various humanitarian projects in Gaza. This report showcases the progress and support provided during this critical period.



A Timeline of Relief (October 2023 - August 2024)

October 2023



South of Gaza

1,483 families benefited from food vouchers, hot meals, food packs, and boxes of bottled water.



Gaza City, Al Rimal, Al Shati Refugee Camp, Al Naser Neighborhood

40,000 individuals benefited from hot meals.



Al Kuwaiti Hospital, Al Shifa Complex

Thousands of patients benefited from medical aid and equipment like trolleys for ECG machines, surgical gloves, hydraulic ICU and patient beds, ECG machines, and vital signs monitors.

Jabalia Camp

60+ individuals benefited from ready to eat meals.



Al Aqsa Hospital

250 individuals benefited from cooked meals.



Deir Al Balah Services Club

1,250 individuals benefited from cooked meals and dignity kits.



Deir Al Balah Refugee Camp

500 individuals benefited from cooked meals.



UNRWA Schools and Shelters Across Gaza Strip

1,700,000+ individuals benefitted from food and clean water.

288,000 hot meals distributed over 3 months

135,000 individuals received healthcare and psychosocial support over 3 months



April 2024

Rafah

15 dignified shelters for 75-100 individuals

South/Rafah/Deir al Balah

The soup kitchen provided 10,000 hot meals

358 veggie bags distributed to 1,790 individuals (over 3 days)

3,660 hot meals with meat served to 10,980 individuals

Zakat ul Fitr distributed to 5,000 individuals



May 2024

Dair El Balah – Middle Area – Gaza Strip

1,750 individuals benefited from baby milk bottles, and food and vegetable parcels

Mobile clinics

5,344 refugees served across 33 camps

Kitchen-hot meals

30,000 people benefited

Water well rehabilitation

Al Khair water well:

benefiting 65,000+ people in addition to 5 shelters and 3 medical centers

Al Naser water well:

benefiting 150,000 people

June 2024

Eid ul-Adha Project

10,650 individuals benefited from Shares of Meat and Eid Gifts

600+ children benefitted from clothes, cash, and Eid events



Humaniti Camp

Humaniti has launched a shelter initiative in Deir Al Balah, south of Gaza City, to provide a secure and integrated living environment for Gazan families which will be sustained for 6 months.

Beneficiaries

130 Families vs the original goal of 100

Features:



Shelter and Facilities

We have equipped tents with beds and kitchen facilities and have set up a **school, mosque, communal kitchen, and children's** playground.



Sanitation

24 latrines and daily deliveries of drinking water for **six months**.



Educational Support

School bags and stationery for children.



Sustainable Energy

Solar powered.

July 2024

Gaza Strip

130 families are receiving shelter in the Humaniti Camp

150 orphans are benefiting from food supplies, general medical checkups, psychosocial support, and seasonal clothing

1,000 orphans (ages 0-5) received:

0-2 years: Milk, diapers, food, and seasonal clothes

2-5 years: Food, seasonal clothes, and toys

Additional in-kind support included nutrition, hygiene supplies, community support, monthly assistance, and regular follow-ups



Emergency Hygiene Kits and Medical Aid

to reduce the transmission of infectious diseases, especially in response to a scabies outbreak.

2,500 people benefited in two shelters in the Gaza Strip

130 families benefited in Humaniti Shelter Village

370 families benefited in Deir el Balah and Al Zawaida shelters

Water well drilling and pump installation

to provide a sustainable clean water source, powered by solar energy to ensure continuous operation.

40,000 people are benefiting from clean water



August 2024

Gaza Strip

40 cubic meters of clean water provided via trucks, benefiting hundreds of people

100 families benefited from vegetable baskets

1 Takiyah kitchen was established, benefiting hundreds with hot meals

100 families benefited from cooked meals

50 families benefited from hygiene kits

50 families received cash assistance (\$130 per family)

1,000 families benefited from food parcels



Khan Younis, Al Mawasi, Gaza City, and North Gaza

1,000 families benefited from food baskets in Khan Younis

3,600 hot meals provided over 7 days in Khan Younis, Mid Region, Gaza City, and the North

829 essential food parcels distributed to displaced individuals living in tents in central Gaza

Pallets of medication are being provided to medical points operated by the PCRFB in southern and central Gaza

Medication worth \$2,500 was provided to Patient Friends Charity Hospital in Al-Rimal. 7,714 individuals benefited from clean drinking water

Mid-Regional Displacement Camps

3,000 children under 5 years of age benefited from infant formula and diapers





Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) Across Gaza

Provision of life-saving SRH medicines, supplies, and equipment to hospitals across Gaza.

5,500 pregnant women will benefit from delivery kits

541,567 women of reproductive age will benefit from dignity kits

690,000+ menstruating women and adolescent girls will benefit from dignity kits
